

A warm welcome to our school...

The principle aim at 345 Nursery is to make sure your child has the happiest start on their educational journey and to ensure that when they leave us they have gained a sense of independence, self-confidence and a real desire to learn.

345 provides a safe, happy and warm atmosphere in which children can explore and discover that learning is fun. We particularly value the importance of learning in the outdoors and collaborating as a team whilst promoting responsibility. Throughout their day, whether at play, doing art and craft or any other activity, they will be learning a variety of social and communicative skills – sharing and caring for others, expressing their opinions, coping with their emotions, natural inquisitiveness and growing awareness of all that is around them.

Our curriculum is as broad as possible – offering the children a taste of innumerable experiences whilst covering The Early Years Foundation Stage as compiled by the DFES. We select topics which reflect the children's interests and base our learning and art projects around them. The children's results are always on view around the school and they take great pride in showing everyone what they have produced.

At the centre of the Early Years Foundation Stage are 3 prime areas, Communication and Language, Physical Development and Personal, Social and Emotional Development. There are 4 further specific areas; Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. All areas are important and inter-linked.

At the core of our planning is the child as an individual. We adapt our teaching to suit the way each child learns and to meet their particular needs. We believe that the key to successful learning is underpinned by having good critical thinking skills, the ability to listen, retain and apply the information and skills they have gained. Children need to have the confidence to predict outcomes, work collaboratively and challenge situations.

We also place great importance on all forms of music and have a resident music teacher. We have peripatetic teachers for Sport and Spanish.

The entire school performs a musical Nativity Play at Christmas; we have a Sports Day in the Summer and an annual topic related trip each Spring. We also invite a variety of local people to visit 345 during the school year, for example the police, fire brigade, nurses and doctors. We have science and music workshops, informal concerts for Mothers and Grandparents Days and Bring your Daddy to school day. In addition we arrange trips to the theatre, art galleries and museums.

We operate 345 with a structured morning, giving the children a sense of security in the familiar pattern of each day. The children work individually and in groups, learning through play, exploration and investigation, and are introduced to letters and numbers at an early stage.



Children have the opportunity to stay for a packed lunch and join in the Afternoon School until 3.15pm. The afternoon sessions are optional, allowing parents to choose additional themed learning classes as suits.

All our teachers are trained whether as full primary teachers, Montessori or Early Years practitioners or have Degrees in Early Years; we have additional assistants to ensure we maintain a high ratio of staff to children.

Parents have a vital role to play and are very much valued as part of our team. We believe in instilling strong family values which embrace our diverse community. To this end we like to keep in very close contact with parents throughout the time their children are with us. We organise Parents' Evenings in the Autumn and Spring terms at which teachers and parents can discuss progress and we write reports at the end of the Summer Term. Informally, we are always available to discuss any aspect of a child's development. We strongly believe that school plays only one part in this and that we are here to help the children, in any way we can, to reach their highest potential by the time they leave us. The school also has a good and active PTA.

We have excellent relationships with all the primary schools in the area and are happy to assist parents in making the important choice of where to send their children after 345.

We hope this gives you an insight into life at 345, but do please come and see for yourself. We very much look forward to having your children here with us at 345.

TIMETABLE:

The Chicks: 9.20 am - 12.20 pm The Fledglings: 9.30 am - 12.30 pm

Lunch Club: Extends the morning to 1:15 pm Afternoon School: Extends the day to 3.15 pm NB. Early Birds may be dropped off at 9 am.

TERMS:

There are three school terms each with a half term.

AGES:

Children come to 345 Nursery when they are 2 years old.

FEES (AUTUMN 2025 - SUMMER 2026):

Three mornings per week: 2 year olds (first term only):

£2,585 per term

(inclusive of our additional services and extracurricular activities programme including, Sport, Music taught by specialist teachers, forest school activities and community walks depending on days attended)

Five mornings per week: 2 year olds 15 hours Working Parent Entitlement: £1,435.90 per term
Five days per week: 2 year olds 30 hours Working Parent Entitlement: £1,631.50 per term
(Inclusive of our additional services and extracurricular activities programme including, Sport, Music taught by specialist teachers, forest school activities and community walks.)

Five mornings per week: 2 and 3 year olds:

£3,140.50 per term

(inclusive of our additional services and extracurricular activities programme including, Sport, Music taught by specialist teachers, forest school activities and community walks.)

Five mornings per week: 3-4 year olds eligible for 15 hours Universal Funding

Entitlement: £1,904.70 per term

Five days per week: 3-4 year olds eligible for 30 hours Extended Funding: £2,635.70 per term Additional services and extracurricular activities programme, as detailed under 2-3 year olds fees with addition of Spanish and Outdoor Learning Days.

AFTERNOON SCHOOL:

This popular option runs Monday to Friday until 3.15 pm (Children bring a packed lunch)

LUNCH CLUB:

This option extends the morning session for parents wishing to collect their children after lunch at 1.30pm. Children bring a packed lunch to school.

£150 per term for one lunchtime a week or £15 per adhoc session

EARLY BIRD CLUB:

We have an Early Bird Club for parents wishing to drop off their children from 9 am. THERE IS NO ADDITIONAL CHARGE FOR THIS.

EXTRAS:

School smocks (£23) and book bags (£11) are available when you start.

REGISTRATION:

A non-refundable registration fee of £80 is required. PLEASE NOTE: This is an admin fee and does NOT guarantee a place.

THE REGISTRATION PROCESS AND TERMS:

- 1. Parents must complete the registration form, along with registration process payment (£80).
- 2. Places are offered on a first come, first served basis. An official offer letter will be issued if a place is available.
- 3. The acceptance of the offer back to the school must be accompanied by a deposit payment (set out in the offer letter, currently £950).
- 4. The payment is held in the school's deposit account and will be refunded at the end of a child's final term at the school (less any other outstanding sums due to the school). The deposit will be retained by the school if for any reason the acceptance of a place is cancelled or the pupil does not join the school.
- 5. Once a place has been accepted one full academic term's notice in writing is required before the removal or non-commencement of a pupil or one academic term's fees are payable in lieu thereof.
- 6. Term fees are due in full before the due date set out on the invoices (usually the first day of term). A 20% late payment surcharge will be applied to any overdue amounts, unless prior arrangements have been agreed with the nursery principals.
